# 4. FIRST-AID MEASURES

Inhalation:	May cause coughing, difficult breathing and nausea. Immediately call a poison center or doctor. Effects of exposure (inhalation) to substance may be delayed. Inhalation of vapors or contact with substance will

#### Special precautions for fire-fighters:

#### 6. ACCIDENTAL RELEASE MEASURES
